Spring 2019 Newsletter

For the first time in our 30+ years of service, we will be adding 14 new homes to one neighborhood. We are excited to break ground on our Greeneville Development in just a few weeks. Greeneville is a large neighborhood in Norwich which is a Neighborhood Redevelopment Zone.

In the 1800s Greeneville was a major shipping and mercantile hub due to its proximity to the Shetucket River and the textile mills, but the thriving community declined as railways decreased dependency on waterways and as mechanical innovation and cheap foreign labor ended the textile boom in the region.

By the 1950s shops and homes in the area fell into disrepair and blighted properties invited illicit activity and petty crime, stopping new businesses from taking root.

By the Millennium, Norwich created the Neighborhood Revitalization Zone in an effort to encourage new businesses to take root and for structures to be rehabilitated or replaced to encourage new home ownership.

Habitat for Humanity of Eastern Connecticut is proud to be creating 14 affordable homes for homeownership on infill lots in Greeneville. The construction of these simple homes will start this year with a duplex on Golden Street.

The duplex consists of two homes that are each 1,400 square feet, one is a four bedroom, one-and-a-half bathrooms and the other is a three bedroom, one-and-a-half bath, and both units are one level. This simplifies the building process, lowers our trade work costs, and makes it easier for families to age in place. These homes are connected by a four foot-common wall in the laundry/utility room. Each unit will be sold independently to a Habitat family. In this way, we are able to maximize the amount of families served with this large parcel while providing the families with privacy and a true sense of ownership.

As with all HFHECT homes, this duplex will be built with energy-efficient and sustainable building practices and is planned to receive an Energy Star Certification. These homes are close to SEAT bus stops with daily routes to points of interest across the region, including the larger area employers.

The homes on Baltic Street are a one-story, ranch style with three bedrooms. These houses will be built so that there is a no-step entry, enabling the home buyers to age in place. The homes feature large insulated windows, a significant roof overhang, and dark floors – elements which help to keep the home cooler in the summer and warmer in the winter.

The final phase of the Greeneville Development is the five duplex units on Sylvester Street. These duplexes will provide eight housing units that are attached by a small common wall that is at the rear of each home and two housing units that are attached by a common breezeway. These homes are unique designs that allow us to take full advantage of having a large parcel to build on and satisfy the City of Norwich's mandate to create multi-family housing. We are able to serve more families with this innovative and cost-effective design, but still allow families the autonomy and privacy of owning a free-standing, single-family unit.

Our overall investment in Greeneville will be approximately \$2.5 million. The development will generate an estimated \$48,000 in new tax revenue annually for the City of Norwich; and will help to fund municipal services like local education, waste disposal, road repair and maintenance, and public water and sewer maintenance.

Your investment of time and treasure in making these homes a reality is crucial!



From our CEO

Dear friends,

Thank you so much for your efforts to support decent shelter for all. We are deeply humbled you have chosen this mission to enact change in the world. Every step forward we make in sheltering another family is only possible because of you – our partners. Whether you provide donations to our stores, financial assistance, or your precious time, you are making a difference in the lives of others. We hope you find enrichment and joy in doing so.

In 2018 we completed six homes locally (housing 23 individuals) and funded the construction of one and a half homes internationally. In 2019 we are positioned to complete six local homes as well. We just completed our renovation on a raised ranch on Raymond Hill Road in Montville; and are working on renovations of a one story ranch on Chapman Road in Groton and a Cape Cod style home on Commerce Avenue in Danielson. We are also planning to build a home on Flanders Road in East Lyme on a lot donated by the estate of the late Ben Orvedal, a beloved volunteer and donor. Lee Watrous, our retired construction director, will lead this build in tribute to Ben. Finally, we will soon begin the construction of two homes in the Greeneville neighborhood of Norwich.

The two homes in Norwich are the first of 14 homes we will be building in Greeneville, and the first multi-home neighborhood since the Davis Farm community in New London, where we built six homes in 2009. In the Greenville area of Norwich we hope to build 14 homes, with two of these starting this spring followed by two more starting in the fall. Equally exciting as building in one neighborhood are the new home designs we will be implementing. These designs will allow us to better leverage some very large parcels, upon which we will build duplexes attached by a very small, four foot common wall. This will allow more families to gain access to decent and affordable shelter while helping the neighborhood gain new, vested home owners.

These are exciting initiatives which more than ever require your support.

We are seeking volunteers with an interest in or knowledge of building and a willingness to teach others to serve as Crew Leaders. This is an important new position which will be instructed by our professional construction staff to help ensure all of our construction volunteers receive the guidance they need to be as effective as possible.



Crew Leaders will ideally work at least one day each month. To help us move projects forward we are recruiting "faithful framers." These are individuals who can commit to volunteering on a construction site one day a week, and there is no experience necessary to help!

Our two ReStores are breaking records achieving \$776,000 in sales in 2018! We are very appreciative of our donors, our shoppers, our extraordinary staff and volunteers. We can always use more donations, shoppers, and volunteers. If you're a people person, please consider volunteering at one of the ReStores.

Thank you to our partner homeowners – who made \$130,000 in mortgage payments in 2018, helping still more families, realize affordable, decent shelter. Congratulations to the following families who paid off their mortgages in 2018 – the Grants (Salem), the Greene's (New London), the Sanborn's (Norwich) and the Castleberry's (Waterford).

We are especially grateful for Michael Slossberg, and United Building Supply for donating multiple locations of inventory to our ReStore as they transitioned to new ownership.

The need in our community



Although Connecticut is often portrayed as a very affluent state, that affluence is uncommon and concentrated in discrete areas. In our service area in New London and Windham counties, there is a dire need for affordable housing that is in decent condition, and is safe and without health hazards.

According to the United Way's ALICE (Asset-Limited, Income-Constrained, Employed) Report, 39% of New London County households and 38% of Windham County households struggle to afford basic needs.

In order for a family of four (two adults, one toddler, and one school-aged child) to earn a "survival budget" that covers basic needs like housing, food, and healthcare, a family would need to earn \$71,500 each year in Windham Co. and \$75,000 annually in New London Co.

1 in 3 households in our community struggles to afford their rent or mortgage payments.

The families we partner with to build our simple, decent houses have had to make difficult decisions for their family's well-being - sometimes having to choose to pay rent instead of filling a medical perscription, or choosing inexpensive processed foods over fresh and nutrient-rich food.

No hardworking family should have to make choices like this.

We are ensuring that families can achieve stability and health by purchasing an affordable habitat home. We are ensuring that families have a decent place to live and build strength and self-reliance through home ownership.
