Honoring Our Past, Celebrating the Present, Shaping Our Future

To our Friends and Supporters,

On January 10, 2022, we dedicated the 97th and 98th homes in our affiliate's history to two wonderful young families. The new homeowners, volunteers, community partners, staff, and local clergy braved the cold to come together and celebrate Habitat's mission in action. It was a memorable day.

January 10th was also the first day of my new role as Executive Director. I watched the ceremony and wondered how we got to such a monumental place - handing someone the keys to their first new home - and what that process entailed.

While learning about a family's journey from "homeowner application" to "homeowner dedication", it became clear that the key to building up communities is developing strong, positive relationships that work together at every step.

To honor not only the affiliate's achievements, but also the time and talent of all who came before us, we'll be celebrating two significant milestones this year. In May we will dedicate homes #99 and #100 on Sylvester Street in Norwich. And later this summer, we'll celebrate our 35th anniversary!

What do all of these achievements mean for our future? More homes. More opportunities for families to move out of inadequate housing. More safe neighborhoods where children can play and grow. More reusable material recycled at our ReStores. More people working side-by-side.

Our team is finding new ways to tell our story, dive deeper into the entirety of our service area, plan for the

projects that are already in front of us, and swing for the fences on future developments. Anyone can be a part of the solution for families in need of a safer home. How? Advocate. Build. Call. Engage. Give. Share. Volunteer. Write.

The need for affordable housing in Eastern Connecticut continues to grow and, with your support, Habitat is working to help more families in our region build a decent place to live.

We are building six more homes this year in the Greeneville neighborhood in Norwich, and have plans to complete seven additional Norwich home rehabilitation projects.

But that's not all! We are finishing homes in Willimantic and Danielson, and will begin working soon on homes in Gales Ferry and Sterling.
